

TERMS AND CONDITIONS FOR TECHNICAL EXCURSIONS TO BGE'S DEEP GEOLOGICAL REPOSITORY SITES AND MINES

- Minimum age 18 years at the time of the visit.
- You need to submit details of a valid personal identification document (ID card or passport) and carry it with you on the day of the visit.
- The visit is not handicapped accessible. Walking aids are not permitted.
- You will receive appropriate equipment and clothing (up to men's size 64 in the DGR Asse II mine; up to men's size 66/shoe size 50 in the DGR Morsleben)
- Short notice changes or cancellations are possible in rare occasions.
- Photography is permitted for private use, movie and sound recordings are not permitted.
- You will receive a security briefing before entering the underground facilities.

An underground visit might pose physical strains due to e.g. temperatures above 35°C at times, darkness, unusual noise, loud noise, tightness and dust production. Therefore, you should be in good physical condition and have no restrictions in mobility. During the underground visit you have to carry a self-contained self-rescue of 5 kg, supplied by BGE. Due to dust production we recommend not to wear contact lenses.

Pregnant persons as well as persons suffering from major physical impairments are not allowed in the underground facilities. This includes, amongst others, major heart and respiratory disease, substantial high blood pressure or distinct diabetes. If in doubt, please consult a doctor for advice beforehand. It is not possible to supply immediate medical support underground.

Visitors enter the premises and visit the site at their own risk. To the extent permitted by law, no liability is assumed for damages. BGE reserves the right to exclude persons from a visit if there is any doubt as to their suitability.
